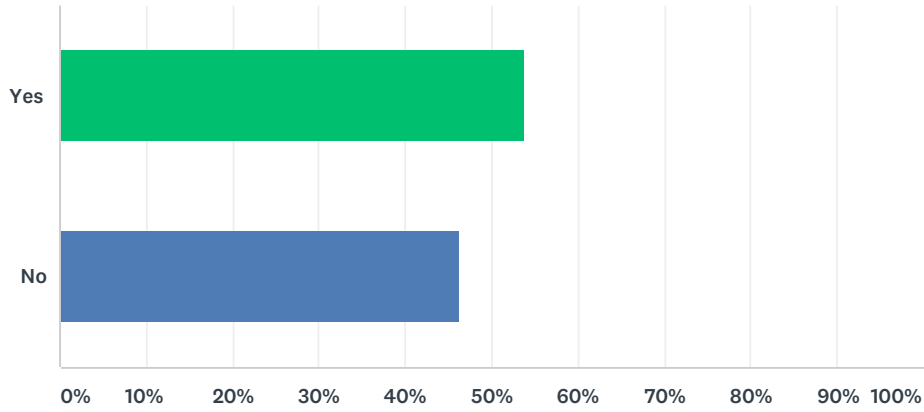

Q11 When you think about the future and the needs of your own family and friends, do you think more houses should be built in Dobcross to meet rising local demand?

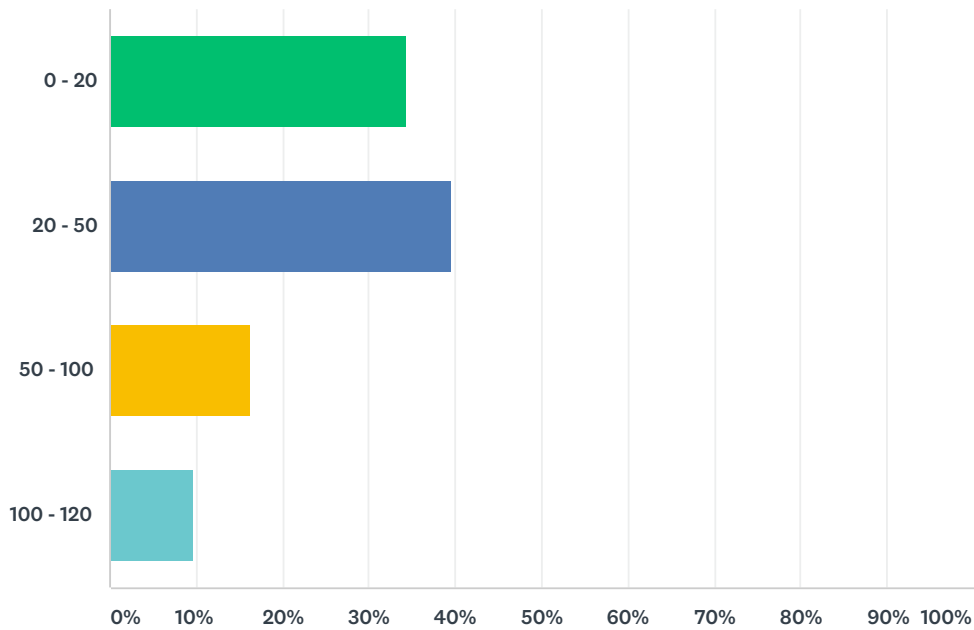

Q12 If yes, how many new houses should be built over the next 20 years?

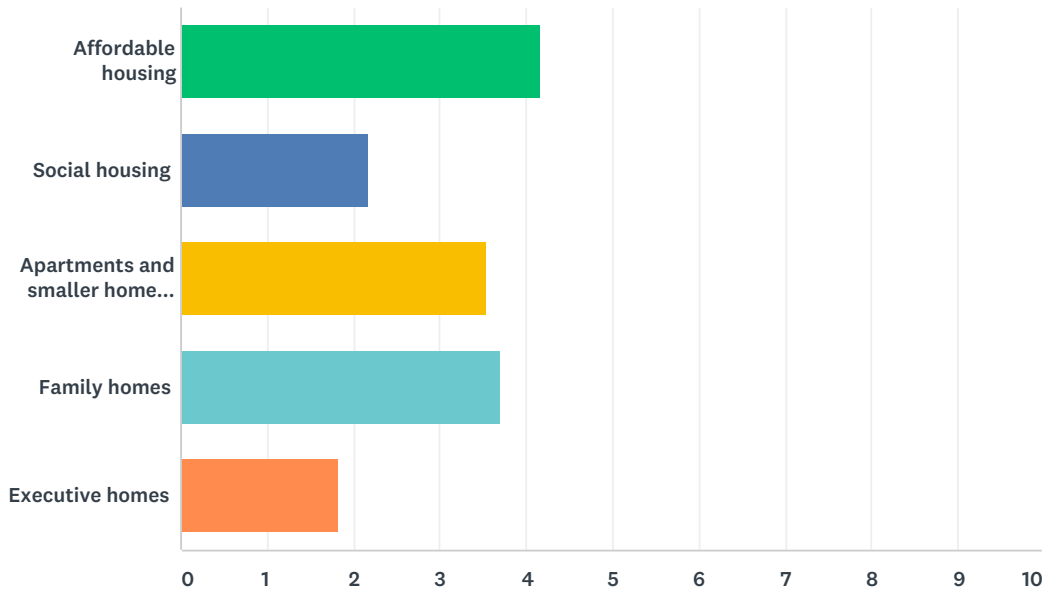

Q13 If you accept that more housing is required, what type of housing would you want to see? Please prioritise the following list with 1 being your preferred and 5 your least acceptable type of development.

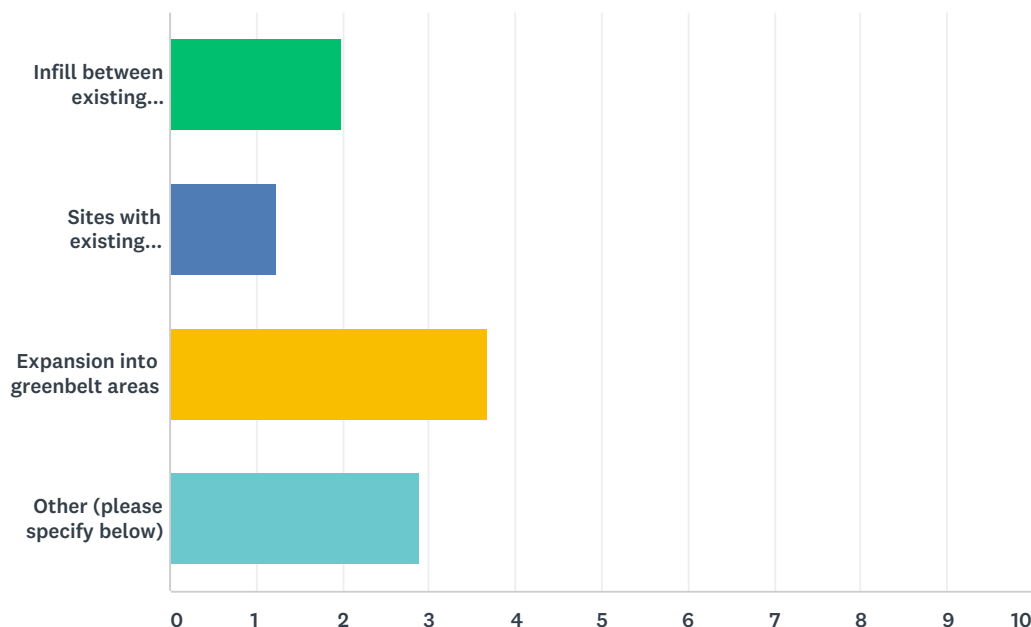

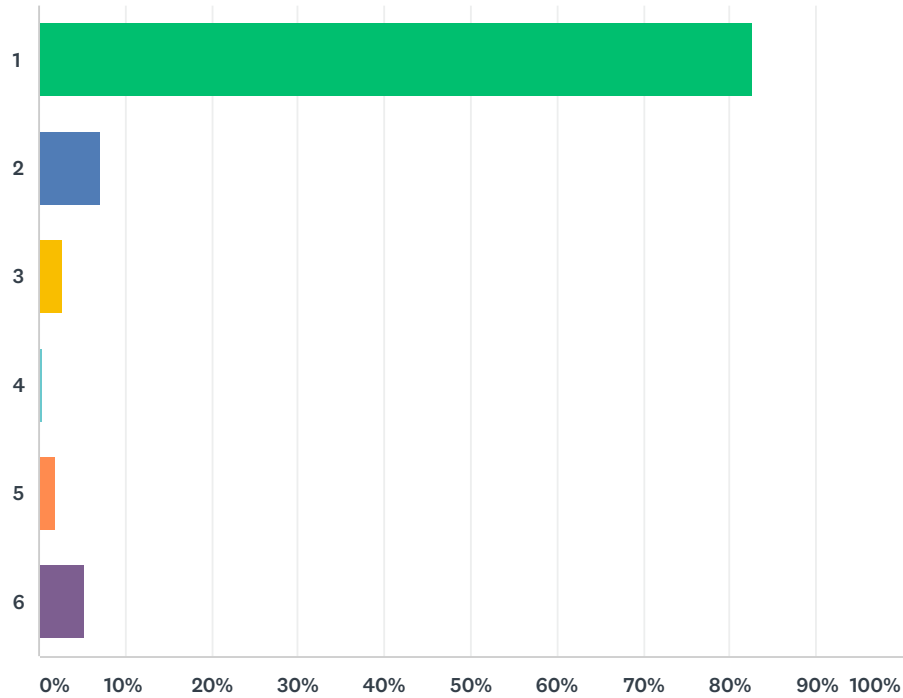

Q35 On a scale of 1 to 6, how important is it to you that Dobcross has a Post Office and local shop where 1 is VERY important and 6 is NOT important.

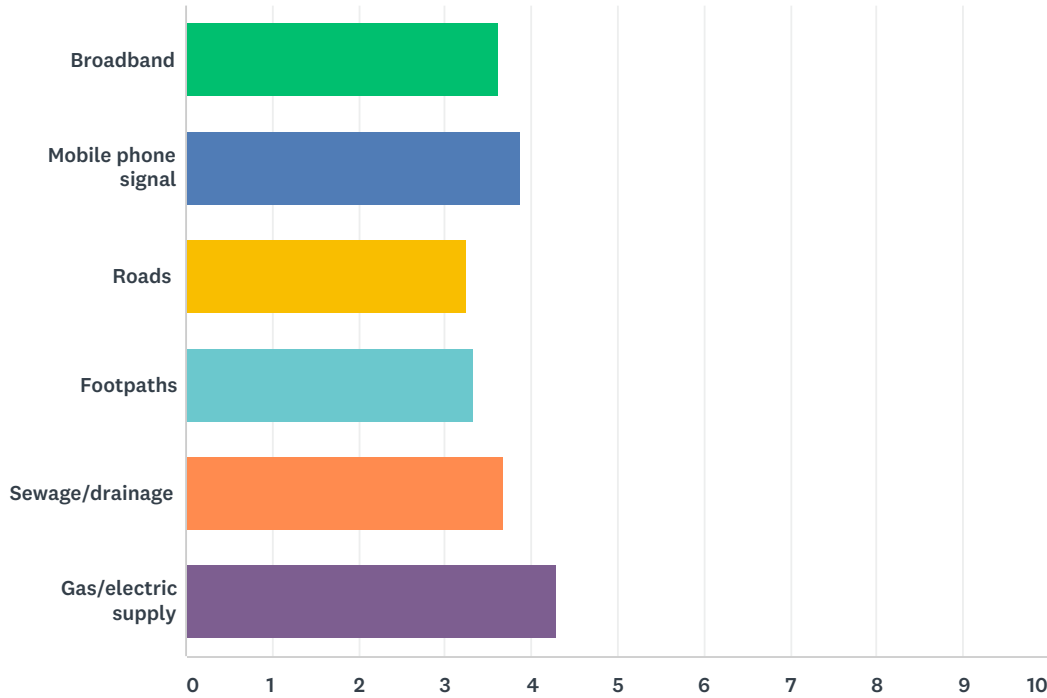

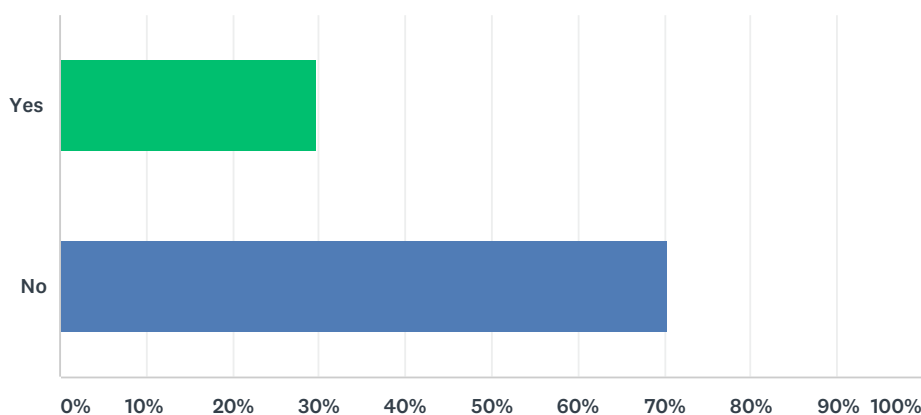

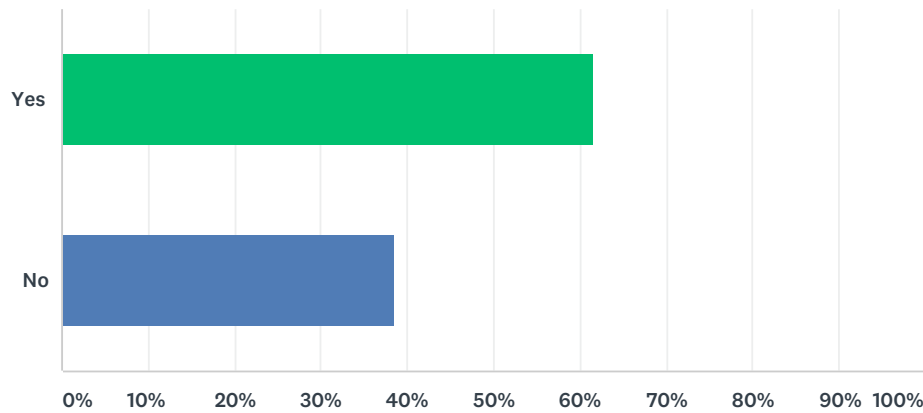
